You think the current weather has been hot?

The Summer of 1939

The 1939 heatwave in Australia was a longlasting, record-breaking event that caused significant damage and loss of life: Temperatures reached 47.8°C in Sydney Basin, 49.7°C in Menindee, and over 47°C in Manly and Richmond.

In January 1939, the heat wave at Hay commenced on the first of January with 100.5 F (38.05 C).

There were fourteen successive centuries and no day of the month was under 89 F (31.6 C) maximum.

For the fourteen days from the first of January the average was 109.9 F (43.2 C). For nine consecutive days the average was 113.8 F (45.4 C), and for five consecutive days the average was 116.8 F (47.1 C).

The highest temperature in Wagga Wagga, in 1939 was 116.96 F (47.2 °C) which happened on January 11, with 8 more temps above 107.6 F (42 C.) And no air conditioning!
